Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships can help you to begin a career in your chosen industry, will help you to learn the practical skills and achieve a nationally recognised qualification whilst earning money. Your employer will also help to train and support you and this usually leads to employment within that salon at the end.

Qualifications at Woodspeen are available in 3 different levels starting with introduction at Level 1 through to basic and essential skills that are required at Level 2, through to technical and supervisory that is required at Level 3.

Qualification Process

Thorough training is essential for today's competitive market. A national vocational qualification is a recognised qualification based upon standards developed by the industry and commerce. You will study towards your qualification which will demonstrate your practical competency and knowledge. To get a qualification, you need to show you've got a particular set of skills. Your assessor will visit you at work and observe your performance within the salon; this will be recorded in your logbook. You will attend training days at the centre to develop your skills and abilities further.

Apprenticeships are also known as:

- **Apprenticeship/Advanced Apprenticeship (England)**

Apprenticeships are not qualifications in their own right. Instead they are a framework made up of many elements.

- **A work based qualification that is designed to ensure the apprentice is job ready, such as an NVQ at either Level 2 or 3**
- **A qualification in English and Maths**

The skills for English and Maths are also called: **Functional Skills (England)**

There are 2 Levels of Apprenticeships **Level 2, Level 3**

What does a Hairdresser or Barber do?

Hairdressers and barbers offer services such as cutting and shaping the client's hair however can also offer specialist services such as colouring and colouring and colour correction.

Barbers are likely to offer traditional men's barbering services such as shaving, cutting facial hair and the more advanced barber will offer patterns in the hair.

Hairdressers with advanced skills can offer wedding hair or even Avante Garde styles for fashion shows or theatre. Those with the higher level qualifications often work in management roles and become salon owners.

Hairdressing - School Provision:

Woodspeen Training work with many schools in Bradford & West Yorkshire providing training as part of the 14-19 vocational programmes initiative. Learners work in our town centre training salon, attending 1 or 2 days per week, the remainder of their time is spent at school.

Learners work towards NVQ Level 1 in Hairdressing and this gives them a head start if they later wish to pursue a career in hairdressing.
